

## FREQUENTLY ASK QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

### Q1. What happens if my child is late?

If your child arrives after **8:45am** you should bring your child to the **main entrance** and he / she will need to be signed in late and a member of the admin team will take them to their class.

If your child arrives after **8.50am** they will receive a **late after registration** mark. If your child arrives after **9:00am** this absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Lateness will be monitored by the school by letters and telephone communication.

### Q2. Can my child attend school when he/she is on medication?

Yes, your child can come back to school as soon as he/she is feeling better. You will need to bring the medication to school and complete a medical form allowing a member of staff to administer the medication.

### Q3. Do we have to provide proof of a medical appointment?

The school may request medical evidence can either be an appointment card to show that your child has been seen by a doctor or any medication that a doctor has prescribed.

### Q4. Will the school monitor my child's attendance?

The school monitors attendance for all children closely and the name of any child whose attendance is below 96% is entered on a monitoring list. Parents receive a letter notifying them that their child's attendance is below 96%.

### Q.6 Can we take family holidays during term time?

**NO.** Family holidays must be taken during school holidays and **NOT** during term time. If you take your child out of school to go on holiday you will receive a Fixed Penalty Notice and your child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

### Q.7. What is a Fixed Penalty Notice?

A Fixed Penalty Notice is a fine issued by the Local Authority to parents who take their child on holiday, or out of school, during term time without the express consent of the school. Such absences are referred to the Local Authority who may impose a fixed penalty fine of £80 if paid within 21 days rising to £160 per parent for each child if paid within 28 days.

If the notice remains unpaid after the 28th day, the Local Authority prosecutes the parent in the Magistrates' Court for the original non-attendance offence under The Education Act 1996, section 444, and not for non-payment of the penalty notice. If found guilty, parents will have a criminal record, possibly receive a fine of up to £1,000, for a first offence, and be required to pay costs to the Local Authority. **There is no right of appeal against a Fixed-Penalty Notice.**

### Q.8. What can I do to encourage my child to attend school?

Make sure your child gets enough sleep and gets up in plenty of time each morning to have breakfast before coming to school. Ensure that they leave home in school uniform and any items they need for the day e.g. homework, PE kit, swimming kit. Look in their school bags and communicate with your child's teachers. Show your child, by your interest, that you value their education.

### Q.9. My child is trying to avoid coming to school. What should I do?

Contact a member of staff immediately and discuss your concerns. Your child could be avoiding school for a number of reasons:

- Difficulties with school work,
- Friendship problems
- Family difficulties

## ATTENDANCE INFORMATION AT FURZEHAM PRIMARY & NURSERY SCHOOL

### PARENT'S LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY

A child is of statutory school age between 5 and 16 years old. A parent's legal responsibility is to ensure the regular, full-time attendance of their child/ren in school. Failure to do this for a prolonged period of time and without notice, could lead to legal proceedings from the Local Authority.

### SCHOOL TARGET

The local authority and school governing body have set a target of **96%** attendance. We acknowledge government guidelines that state a child's attendance at school is directly related to attainment outcomes. **Children who miss 67 days of school (which is the equivalent to one term of missed curriculum) will impact on their learning and result in reduced attainment. Long term this will have implications on children's KS1 and KS2 SATS results and G.C.S.E. results when in secondary education.**

### REPORTING YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE

On the first day of your child's absence please contact the school via telephone 01803 853347 (answer machine if before 8am) or emailing [office@furzeshamprimary.org.uk](mailto:office@furzeshamprimary.org.uk). We will contact you by telephone or text if your child fails to attend school in time for morning registration if we have not heard from you.

### THE SCHOOL DAY

The school gates are open from **8.40am** for the children to go straight to class. **Registration is at 8.45am and lessons begin at 8.50am.** We expect all children to be in school starting lessons at this time. If children arrive after **8.50am** they will receive a late mark and after **9.00am** absence is recorded as (U) which is an unauthorised absence for one session.

### HOLIDAY

The current legislation issued to schools from the Department for Education around taking holidays in term-time states: *In accordance with The Education Pupil Registration England Amendment Regulations 2013 No. 756: Leave of absence shall not be granted by schools unless there are 'exceptional circumstances'.*

- If your child is just 'feeling under the weather', we can provide support at school by encouraging them to drink plenty of water and providing a space indoors during break and lunchtime. We can also administer medicines, (you may be requested to fill in a medical form in this instance) such as calpol, paracetamol or cough medicine and we will always contact you if the situation worsens.

### ATTENDANCE TERMLY REWARD SYSTEM

### **BRONZE CERTIFICATE / SILVER CERTIFICATE / GOLD CERTIFICATE**

If a pupil has 100% attendance from September to July, they will receive all three certificates. Those pupils with 100% attendance in two of the terms will receive a bronze and silver certificate (this does not have to be consecutively). All pupils with 100% attendance in one term will receive a bronze certificate. Pupils who achieve 100% attendance each term will be entered into a raffle to **win a £10 voucher**.

### ATTENDANCE BEAR

Each week our whole school attendance is celebrated with the highest class attendance and is displayed in the school hall. Our attendance bear spends the week with the class that has achieved the highest attendance the previous week.
