History is our driver subject this term. The children will be learning about childhood and comparing how it was in the 1950s and the present day, using artefacts, including a trip to a local museum and a range of different sources. We will focus on everyday life and childhood in the 1950s. We will look at how the train station and train line used to bring transport in to Brixham in the 1950s compared to the transport now. We will also look at timelines and family trees. Finally, we will learn about the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II.		We will be developing our writing through focussing on the basics of full stops, capital letters and forming sentences. We will be looking at a few different genres, including: narratives and autobiographies. We will be developing our reading skills through a range of fiction and non-fiction texts in Whole Class Reading, sharing a Class Story for pleasure and working from model texts in our writing units. We will be learning a range of spelling rules as well as national curriculum statutory words which will then be assessed regularly.		We will be developing our understanding of place value, by reading, writing, comparing and ordering numbers up to 10. We will be learning how to use some of the language associated with this including, fewer, more, same, less than, greater than and equal to. We will be also learning how to add and subtract numbers up to 10 using part whole models, fact families, number bonds and number lines. We be learning about everyday materials.		We will describe the parts of a flowering plants and relate structure to function, including the roots and the stem for transporting water, leaves for making food and the flower for reproduction. We will also be learning about light and dark, investigating the phenomena of reflections and shadows, looking for patterns in collected data.		Mix It - This project teaches children about basic colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of primary and secondary colours and how artists use colour in their artwork.  Funny Faces and Fabulous Features - This project teaches children about the concept of the portrait and how the collage technique can be used to make a portrait.

We will be following units called Being Me in My World and Celebrating Differences which will include a range of activities and thought-provoking discussions.
