History is our driver subject this term. The children will be learning about the growth and decline of the Roman Republic and the Roman Empire. The children will study Boudicca's rebellion, Hadrian's wall, and the Romanisation of Britain, including how Christianity came to Britain.

We will be developing our reading skills through a range of fiction and non-fiction texts in Whole Class Reading, sharing a Class Story for pleasure and working from model texts in our writing units.

We will be learning a range of spelling rules as well as national curriculum statutory words which will then be assessed regularly.
